

ADDITION

2.1 ALSO = también

POSITION: usually between the subject and the verb / after the verb "to be"
*She speaks English. She **also** speaks French and German.*
*My bed is old. It is **also** very narrow.*

2.2 TOO / AS WELL = también

POSITION: at the end of the sentence
*She speaks French and German **too** / **as well**.*

2.3 IN ADDITION,
BESIDES,
MOREOVER, (fml)
FURTHERMORE, (fml)
WHAT 'S MORE, } = además

POSITION: CONJUNCT- Beginning of the sentence. Followed by a comma.

USE: they introduce more information of the same type about a topic.

*He has no money. **In addition**, he is unemployed.*

*I can't go to the cinema; I'm busy. **Besides**, I don't have any money.*

*Gaudi was the architect of the Sagrada Familia. **Moreover**, he designed many other buildings.*

*Mobile phones are getting cheaper and cheaper. **Furthermore**, their quality is improving*

2.4 BESIDES/IN ADDITION TO / AS WELL AS = además de
BESIDES THIS, / IN ADDITION TO THIS, = además de esto

POSITION: Followed by a PRONOUN , NOUN OR GERUND

*I play other sports **besides** football and basketball.*

***Besides** working in a bookshop she looks after the garden.*

***In addition to** working as a teacher, he (also) writes articles for a newspaper.*

*You'll need strong boots **as well as** your backpack to go trekking.*

***As well as** playing tennis three times a the week, I (also) play football at the weekend.*

2.5 BOTH ... AND= tanto... como

***Both** my boyfriend **and** me like historical novels. We always share our books.*

***Both** men **and** women have complained about that new advertisement.*
