## dependent prepositions (1)

Many verbs, nouns and adjectives are used with particular prepositions.

I am applying for a holiday job at the zoo. adjective: Valentino is interested in motorcycle racing. There has been an increase in the temperature.

Words with a similar or opposite meaning often take the same preposition.

care / worry about someone apply / ask / send for information depend / rely on someone

There are no really useful rules to help you. In the tables below there are some common dependent preposition combinations which you need to learn. (SO = somebody, ST = something).

We can often put an -ing form after a preposition.

They talked about closing the school. I'm thinking of buying a motorbike. He apologized **for losing** the compositions. He insisted **on coming** with us.

(\*) Some verbs can go with different prepositions, depending on the situation.

I agree with you. I agree about the football team.

Lenny apologized to the teacher. Lenny apologized for arriving late. What do you think of the concert? (= What is your opinion?)

My parents are thinking about a holiday abroad this year. (= They are considering it.) He writes for a newspaper. He writes about sport. Did you write to your mother?
