## Turn the following sentences into reported speech (1)

→ **Gloria suggested going for a walk. // Gloria suggested that we go for a walk.**
- He asked me, "Do you still want to go to the show?"  
→ **He asked me if I still wanted to go to the show.**
- "It was wonderful to meet them last night!," Susan exclaimed.  
→ **Susan exclaimed that it had been wonderful to meet them the previous night.**
- "Do you want to come to the cinema with me?" he asked me.  
→ **He asked me if I wanted to go to the cinema with him.**
- "These people are not listening to their friends now", said the waiter.  
→ **The waiter said that those people were not listening to their friends then/in that moment.**
- "Where did you hide my glasses?" Lucy asked her little sister.  
→ **Lucy asked her little sister where she had hidden her glasses.**
- "My emotions are so complex that I can't understand myself", the teenager claimed.  
→ **The teenager claimed that his/her emotions were so complex that he/she couldn't understand himself/herself.**
- The banker told me: "Don't give me the money now."  
→ **The banker told me not to give him/her the money then/in that moment.**
- "Let's go to the cinema on Tuesday", said Mary.  
→ **Mary suggested going to the cinema on Tuesday. // Mary suggested that we go to the cinema...**
- He told his daughters: "Don't talk aloud because your little brother is sleeping".  
→ **He told his daughters not to talk aloud because their little brother was sleeping.**
- "Can you do me a favour?" Liz asked me.  
→ **Liz asked me for a favour. // Liz asked me if I could do her a favour.**
- "She may be a Muslim, because she covers her body and head with long clothes", people thought.  
→ **People thought (that) she might be a Muslim, because she covered her body and head with...**
- "Put on your scarf if you are going out," Susan told her son.  
→ **Susan told her son to put on his scarf if he was going out.**
- Boyan Slat said: "I am going to earn a lot of money with this device".  
→ **Boyan Slat said (that) he was going to earn a lot of money with that device.**
- Nada asked: "Don't they have any compassion?"  
→ **Nada asked if they didn't have any compassion.**
- A reporter asked the boy: "Why are the Taliban against education?"  
→ **A reporter asked the boy why the Taliban were against education.**
- "I don't care if doughnuts are unhealthy," Mike said.  
→ **Mike said (that) he didn't care if doughnuts were unhealthy.**
- "Did Michael try to call me yesterday?", he said.  
→ **He asked if Michael had tried to call him the day before / the previous day.**
- "We don't worry if people spend too much money," the director said.  
→ **The director said (that) they didn't worry if people spent too much money.**
- Jason told her, "Don't be late to my party tomorrow".  
→ **Jason told her not to be late to his party the following day / the day after.**
